2. Rationale

2.1 Background

According to the 2021 Humanitarian Needs Overview (HNO) for Sudan, there are 13.3 million people in need, the highest number in a decade and a 44 percent increase compared to 2020³. This increase is due to a complex interplay of multiple factors, including conflict, recurring floods, and economic crisis. Heavy rains and flash floods affected more than 314,000 people as of 29 September 2021, destroying or damaging more than 60,000 houses⁴, with West Darfur and South Darfur being among the most affected states. This further compounded the outstanding damage from the 2020 floods, which affected 900,000 people and destroyed 94,000 homes.⁵

Sudan is also affected by a sustained economic crisis, which is driving broad-reaching food insecurity. 9.8 million people are severely food insecure, and cereal prices remain exceptionally high as a result of COVID-19 containment measures,

removal of fuel subsidies and the liberalization of the exchange rate policy. Conflict is also driving insecurity and displacement. On 25 October 2021, the military seized power, violating the power-sharing agreement that had been reached with civilian representatives in September 2019 and thus bringing renewed political and security instability to the country. Local conflict also affects the local population, especially in Darfur. Despite the 2020 peace agreements signed in Juba, violence has continued to erupt throughout 2021, with reports of regular inter-communal conflict throughout the region – affecting in particular West Darfur.⁶

These shocks are in turn causing a sharp increase in internal displacement – as of 27 September 2021, 3.03 million people were internally displaced⁷, compared to the 2.5 million reported in the HNO in December 2020. One of the most affected regions is West Darfur, where sudden mass population movements driven by conflict are common. Geneina, the capital of West Darfur, has hosted approximately 170,000 persons experience protracted displacement, who had resident in three IDP camps on the periphery of Geneina. Frequent, localized conflict between Arab and African ethnic groups in the region have regularly triggered frequent temporary displacement from Geneina's three camps. However, more intense conflict between these groups from January and April 2021 triggered ongoing displacement of virtually the entire population IDP population, who relocated to more secure areas of Geneina and its peripheral villages. In July 2021, a joint IOM-UNHCR verification exercise reported that more than 105,000 individuals were seeking shelter in approximately 100 'gathering sites' within the town of Geneina and its surrounding villages.⁸ It is commonly understood that the majority of the 65,000 remaining IDPs are currently seeking refuge in host community areas of Geneina, living in micro-sites of 1-5 households camped in host community compounds. However, to date, there has been no comprehensive assessment of the location or scale of these sites, or their needs, access to services or who is providing what aid where, leaving humanitarian responders unable to provide coordinated aid delivery to a significant vulnerable population within Geneina.

Internally Displaced Persons (IDPs) in host community locations have a wide range of rapidly shifting needs, however a lack of clear overview and existing coordination gaps are hindering the humanitarian response. REACH therefore proposes a suite of activities aimed at providing support NRC Site Management and other Site Management actors in identifying displacement sites and their priority needs, and to provide information management, assessment, and analysis support to strengthen partner's coordination in Ag Geneina and in West Darfur. This will in turn enable humanitarian actors to better plan the response and deliver better, needs-based assistance to IDPs in West Darfur.

Intended impact

IMPACT, through REACH, will provide Information Management and Assessment and Analysis support to SM implementing partner in West Darfur, NRC, as well as directly to the Site Management Sector Working Group through two phases of activities. The first phase of this activity is a rapid profiling and needs assessments of IDPs in host community areas of Geneina. It will improve the understanding of the current scale, locations and conditions of displaced populations, and inform ongoing humanitarian interventions in the target area. The second phase of activities is still to be determined, but will likely consist of a coordinated assessment of needs in IDP gathering sites.

3. Methodology

3.1 Methodology overview

REACH, in close collaboration with NRC, will conduct an enumeration of the urban and peri-urban areas of Geneina to identify locations where IDPs households are settled in host community compounds, the scale of the population in these areas, their priority needs, how they are accessing essential services and any barriers they face in access services. NRC's field team will be trained by REACH staff to implement the assessment, while REACH provides oversight, quality assurance, data analysis and reporting capacity. Data collection teams will work closely with humanitarian service providers and the displaced community to identify all IDP micro-sites in host community areas of Geneina, then conduct rapid needs and profiling assessments using quantitative methods. **Data collection will be conducted at the micro-sites**

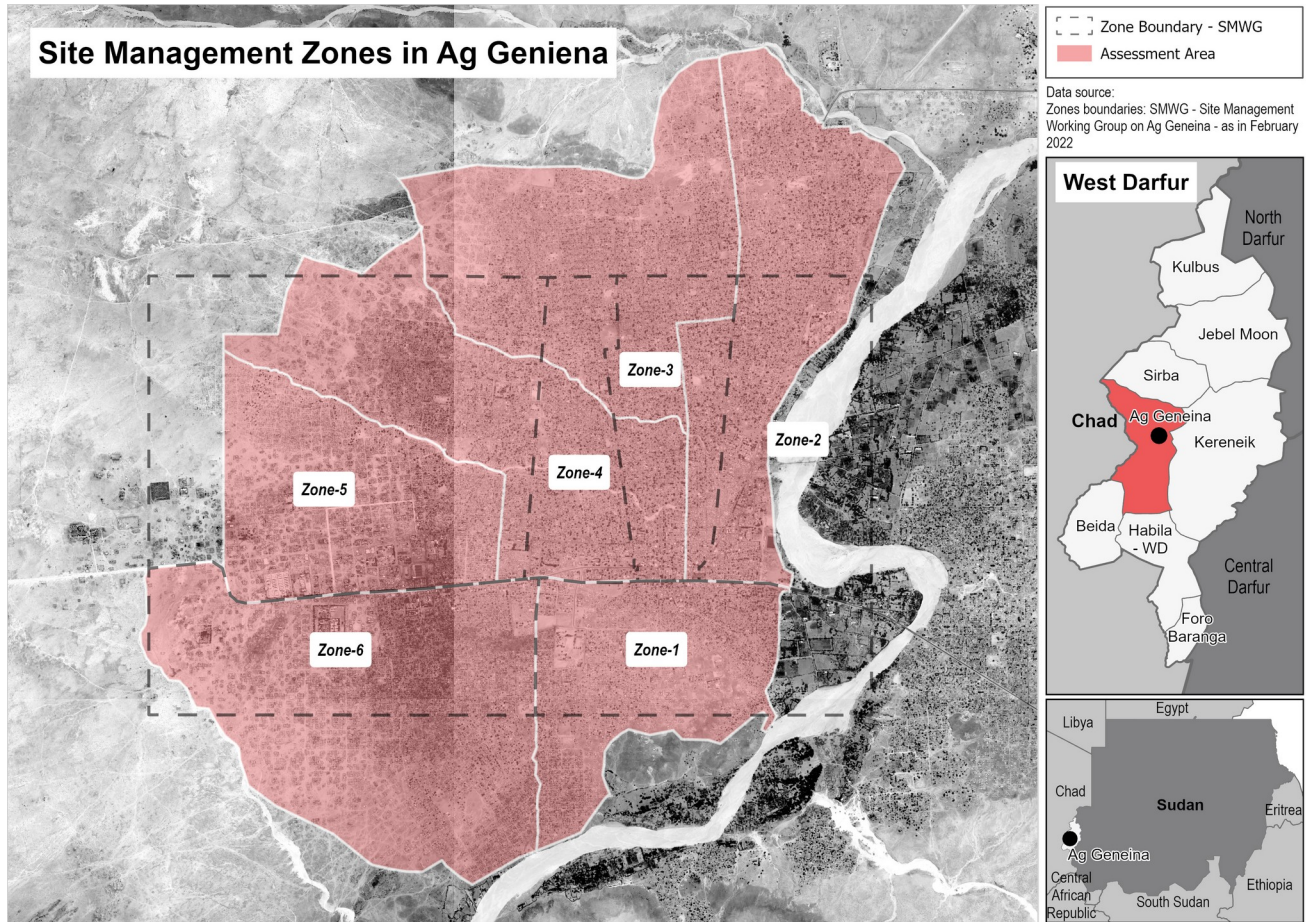

level through a singly KII with a member of the displaced population living in that location able to respond on the behalf of all IDP HH residing at the micro-site. Analysis will be initially focused at the population level to support rapid production of information, then be stratified by Site Management Zones (SM zones, figure 1) to produce zonal- level outputs.

3.2 Population of interest

Research will focus specifically on micro-IDP sites located in host community compounds within the urban and peri-urban areas of Geneina. There is a clear understanding that there is a sizeable displaced populations are here but there is no comprehensive data set to understand the locations, scale of the population or their needs. IDPs living in established informal collective centres, known locally as “gather sites”, will not be included in this research as there have been a number of activities to quantify the populations existing there and identify their needs over the past 6 months. Geographic scope will be limited to urban and peri-urban areas covered by the 6 SM zones as informal discussions with key response actors indicate limited presence of IDPs outside of these areas, and security issues combined with limited resources make any broader-reaching assessment temporarily unviable.

Analysis of assessment findings will focus on ensuring an understanding of the situation at the population level with no geographic disaggregation as the **first priority**. Following initial review of findings, analysis will then be produced at the zonal level if response actors believe this more nuanced understanding of the landscape of issues within the city will support more efficient response planning.

3.4 Primary Data Collection

Data will be collected by NRC field teams, with IMPACT designing the data collection process, working closely with NRC to plan data collection, and to providing quality assurance throughout. An enumeration will be conducted of all IDP micro-sites in host community compounds⁹ within Geneina and its peri-urban areas, as defined by the 6 Site Management zones. There is considerable animus within some sections of the host community toward IDPs, making the use of traditional host community leaders (Umdas, Sheiks) or a door-to-door enumeration challenging. As such, data collection teams will use multiple methods to identify IDP micro-locations for assessment including: gathering locations from humanitarian responders; snowballing contacts through both IDPs in “gathering sites” and KIs in micro-locations; and, using high points (buildings) within the city to identify locations. The approach to data collection is unlikely to yield a full census of IDP micro-sites, but will still fill a recognized information gap and build a baseline on which further activities can expand. Previously identified “gathering sites” **will not** be included, given the availability of information on the scale and needs of their resident population.

The intent of the assessment will be to **produce a rapid and near-comprehensive understanding** of the location and scale of displaced populations, as well as their priority needs at the micro-site level. Future assessments will provide a deeper and more nuanced understanding of needs at the household level. As such, sampling will be purposive, with the simple quantitative questionnaire being administered using mobile data collection devices to a single key informant able to speak on behalf of all IDPs in a given micro-site, which may include multiple households in a single location.

Prior to data collection, NRC field teams will pilot the tool, with a training of enumerators delivered by the REACH Surge Field Manager to ensure everyone is familiar with the tool and the application (Kobo tool) used for data collection. The REACH Surge Field Manager will follow the data collection process closely, and will the REACH GIS Officer, to ensure

3.5 Data Processing & Analysis

Data quality checking using the [IMPACT Data Cleaning Minimum Standards Checklist](#) will be used to outline the process and criteria for data deletion and determine staff responsibilities. Data cleaning will focus on identifying outliers in the data, contradictory or unlikely response options (logical inconsistencies), and suspicious patterns from enumerators. A cleaning log of all changes will be kept and will be available upon request after the REACH publication of datasets.

Data analysis will be conducted using R to produce findings at the population level. Should analysis at the zonal-level be considered useful, as previously mentioned, we will replicate the population-level analysis to produce findings by zone.
